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

M: For the steadfast assurance that nothing can separate us from your love and for the courage to stand firm against the assaults of Satan and every evil, hear our prayer, O Christ.




M: For the well-being of your holy Church in all the world and for those who offer here their worship and praise, hear our prayer, O Lord.

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<sup>7</sup>What soldier ever serves at his own expense? Who plants a vineyard and does not eat some of its fruit? Or who takes care of a flock and does not drink milk from the flock? <sup>8</sup>Am I saying this just from a human point of view? Doesn't the law also say this? <sup>9</sup>Yes, it is written in the Law of Moses, "You shall not muzzle an ox while it is treading out grain." Is God really concerned about oxen, <sup>10</sup>or does he say this entirely for our sake? Yes, it was written for our sake, because the plowman ought to plow in hope, and the thresher ought to thresh in hope of getting a share. <sup>11</sup>If we sowed spiritual seed for your good, is it too much if we reap material benefits from you? <sup>12</sup>If others have some right to make this claim on you, don't we even more? But we did not use this right. Instead, we endure everything so as not to cause any hindrance for the gospel of Christ.



He took the Twelve aside again and began to tell them what was going to happen to him. <sup>33</sup>"Look, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and the experts in the law. They will condemn him to death and will hand him over to the Gentiles. <sup>34</sup>They will mock him, spit on him, flog him, and kill him. On the third day he will rise again."

<sup>35</sup>James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached him and said, "Teacher, we wish that you would do for us whatever we ask."



### **NICENE CREED**

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

### WORDS OF INSTITUTION






