

Scripture Reading

Genesis 3:1-15

3 Now the serpent was more clever than any wild animal which the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Has God really said, 'You shall not eat from any tree in the garden'?" ² The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat fruit from the trees of the garden, ³ but not from the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden. God has said, 'You shall not eat from it. You shall not touch it, or else you will die."

⁴The serpent said to the woman, "You certainly will not die. ⁵In fact, God knows that the day you eat from it, your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." ⁶When the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was appealing to the eyes, and that the tree was desirable to make one wise, she took some of its fruit and ate. She gave some also to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it. ⁷The eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized that they were naked. They sewed fig leaves together and made coverings for their waists. ⁸They heard the voice of the LORD God, who was walking around in the garden during the cooler partof the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. ⁹The LORD God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?"¹⁰The man said, "I heard your voice in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked, so I hid myself." ¹¹God said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree from which I commanded you not to eat?"¹²The man said, "The woman you gave to be with me—she gave me fruit from the tree, and I ate it." ¹³The LORD God said to the serpent: "¹⁴The LORD God said to the serpent:

Because you have done this, you are cursed more than all the livestock, and more than every wild animal. You shall crawl on your belly, and you shall eat dust all the days of your life. ¹⁵ I will put hostility between you and the woman, and between your seed and her seed.^[C] He will crush your head, and you will crush his heel.


Scripture Reading

Galatians 3:7-13

⁷ Understand, then, that those who believe are the children of Abraham. ⁸ Foreseeing that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, Scripture proclaimed the gospel in advance to Abraham, saying, "In you, all nations will be blessed." ⁹ So then, those who have faith are blessed along with Abraham, the man of faith. ¹⁰ In fact, those who rely on the works of the law are under a curse. For it is written, "Cursed is everyone who does not continue to do everything written in the book of the law." ¹¹ Clearly no one is declared righteous before God by the law, because "The righteous will live by faith." ¹² The law does not say "by faith." Instead it says, "The one who does these things will live by them." ¹³ Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us. As it is written, "Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree."

Gospel Reading

⁴John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. ⁵Then Jerusalem, all of Judea, and all the region around the Jordan were going out to him. ⁶They were baptized by him in the Jordan River as they confessed their sins. ⁷But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for his baptism, he said to them, "You offspring of vipers, who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? ⁸Therefore produce fruit in keeping with repentance! ⁹Do not think of saying to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you that God is able to raise up children for Abraham from these stones. ¹⁰Already the ax is ready to strike^[a] the root of the trees. So every tree that does not produce good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.



Lord, have mercy.


For those who bring offerings, those who do good works in this congregation, those who toil, those who sing, and all who await from the Lord great and abundant mercy, let us pray to the Lord:


Lord, have mercy.

For favorable weather, for an abundance of the fruits of the earth, and for peaceful times, let us pray to the Lord:




Prayer of the Day
