I deserve your punishment both now and forever.


But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins



9Then he said:


Here I am. I have come to do your will.

⁵²He has brought down rulers from their thrones.


He has lifted up the lowly.


- ⁵³He has filled the hungry with good things, but the rich he has sent away empty.

and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty.


From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.




